- All students must have a minimum English language proficiency of IELTS 5.5 or equivalent; OR
- Have successfully completed the following courses with Greenwich English College: General English (Upper Intermediate Level 8 weeks*), English for Business (12 weeks), Cambridge PET* FCE and CAE, EVS, EAP and IELTS* (*With exit point of 5.5 or higher).
- Direct entry to students on passing Greenwich English College Placement Test (online and on campus testing options).*
